“Check-out Time”, the first-place award-winning script by James Young, was about an elderly man who has no motivation to continue living. He invites his best friend to be with him as he prepares for his own self-inflicted demise.

“Open Season”, second place winner, by Sandra Kischuk takes place at a cocktail party. Mark explains to Anne while he’s propositioning her, how his relationships with several women does not constitute as cheating on his girlfriend Lisa.

“Go to a Meeting: Short Play Set in 1964” by George Davis is a humor/ tragedy play that will make you laugh and cry. Excellent dialogue won Davis third place.

“Half-Cocked” by Jeff Corydon won honorable mention with his conversation skit between Rupert, a novice script writer, and Susie an FSU freshman. As Rupert explains his craft to Susie at a bus station, he is seduced by Cindy, a horny 30-something business woman.

Carrollwood Players presents nine plays each season at the Carrollwood Playhouse located in Plantation Plaza, 4333-5 Gunn Highway.
